

Insurer

- Covers all specialists, procedures, hospitalizations, long-term care



Provider

- Primary care
- Social services

Care Site

- Primary care clinic

 - Nutrition and personal care



Nationwide PACE data show clear results in clinical outcomes and quality of life

33%	Increase in life expectancy, from 3.9 to 5.2 years for the same population without PACE services
16%	Reduction in re-hospitalization rate
80%	Participants assessed as depressed no longer scored as depressed
\$10k	Taxpayer savings per participant
97.5%	Family caregivers who would recommend PACE to someone in similar circumstances
4.1	Participant satisfaction rating on a 1-5 scale



Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)


- Developed over 40 years ago in San Francisco
- Cares for elderly (Medicare-eligible), socioeconomically vulnerable (Medicaid-eligible), and frail (nursing homeeligible)
- Consists of health insurance and long-term care insurance – fully at risk for the total cost of care
- Provides all medical and social services needed to stay out of the hospital and safely in the home

Our day center is a hub for participant care



Participants visit the PACE day center an average of 2 days per week, depending on need

The day center is supplemented by care in participants' homes and other community locations













Typical participant profile

- Medically complex: Often ~8 chronic conditions
- Frail: 2-3 "activity of daily living" (ADL) limitations
- **Elderly**: Average age of ~80
- **Behavioral health challenges**: Roughly half with dementia and many more with diagnosed behavioral health issues
- Limited social capital: Virtually all qualifying for Medicaid



What is "nursing facility level of care"?

A patient with *one or more* of these health challenges may be eligible for nursing facility level of care:

- Compromised ADLs and IADLs
- Cognitive impairment or behavioral health concerns
- Non-compliance/adherence with medications
- Risk for falls due to mobility issues
- Poorly controlled diabetes mellitus
- Dialysis
- 80 years of age or older

We partner directly with DHCS to determine eligibility

The goal of PACE is to allow frail elderly to obtain high-quality care while continuing to live safely in their community, providing an alternative to nursing facility care for those who do not need it. PACE is not intended to be a replacement for nursing facility care for those who need that level of care.

DHCS's eligibility criteria are designed to achieve that goal:



Reside in the approved PACE service — Obtained during enrollment process area

Meet CA nursing facility of care Determined by DHCS through program's fact-based assessments

Able to live safely in the community with PACE support at the time of enrollment

Determined per state-approved safety eligibility criteria and reviewed by DHCS



How much does PACE cost?

Dual Eligible or Medi-Cal only


- If eligible for Medi-Cal with no share of cost, PACE services are free
- If eligible for Medi-Cal with a share of cost, PACE costs are equal to share of cost

Medicare Only

- Pay a monthly premium to participate in PACE
- Responsible for a premium for Medicare Part D drugs
